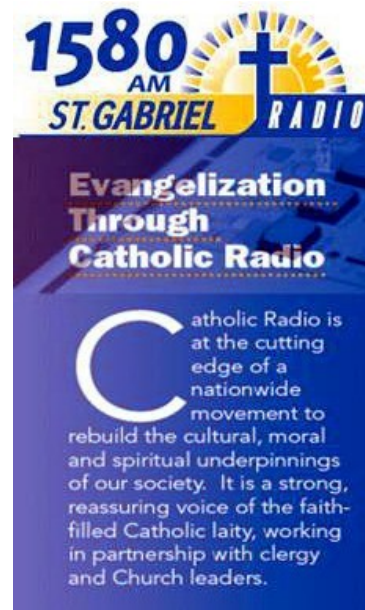


Captain's Report

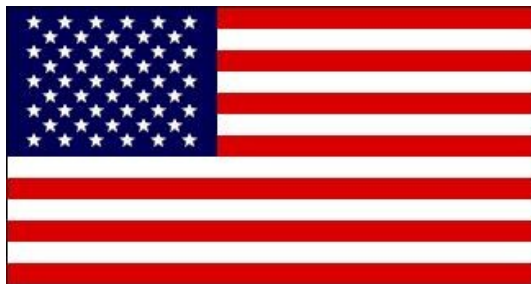

Citizens have been asked to form an Honor Guard along Main Street from the Reynoldsburg Church of the Nazarene, 1340 Crest Street East toward the Glen Rest Memorial Estate Cemetery on East Main following the funeral services. Knights of Columbus 4th Degree in Regalia (or Tux and Social if you do not have Regalia), as well as any and all 1st, 2nd and 3rd degree Knights, will gather in the Parking lot of PFEIFER FUNERAL HOME, 7915 E. Main Street Reynoldsburg **between 10:45 AM and 11:00 AM** to Honor and salute this fallen Soldier as he and his family travel to the cemetery. Maximum attendance displaying our Patriotism and support of our military will be greatly appreciated.

OBITUARY

Sgt. Titus Reynolds, 23, laid down his life for his country on Wednesday, September 24, 2009 in Afghanistan. He was more than a soldier; he was a soul mate, a son, a brother, a friend and a true American hero. Titus was raised in Columbus, Ohio and met his wife Nikki when they were 13. They drifted in and out of contact throughout their teenage years but fell in love at the age of 20. He was a devoted husband who lived for the quiet moments he could spend with her. He was a beloved son and caring friend. His sense of humor lifted the spirits of his friends and brothers-in-arms who worked and fought with him. His strength of character supported those he loved and his belief in God and country is the legacy he leaves to those around him. He had an easy smile and a boyish charm and he fully believed in what he was fighting for in Afghanistan. Though he is not with us anymore, he lives on in the heart of his wife and those who love him. He is with God and may he finally know peace. Titus is survived by his wife, Dominique (Nikki), his parents Rod and Elizabeth, his siblings Rachel, Johnny, and Markie, and several aunts, uncles, and cousins. His family will receive friends Friday from 5-8 p.m. at the Reynoldsburg Church of the Nazarene, 1340 Crest Street, Reynoldsburg, where his service for family and friends will be held Saturday at 10:30 a.m. Interment with military honors to follow at Glen Rest Memorial Estate.

Saturday 10 Oct 2009 - Show Time is 8:30 PM at the Columbus Airport. Tux and regalia not required, casual dress displaying the K of C Logo for all attending. Honor our WWII Military veterans and thank them for their service..

Four brother Knights from Council 5776 along with 76 other Vets are taking an Honor Flight to Washington, DC to visit the WWII Memorial for the first time and maybe the last time. Two of our Brothers are members of Assembly 809 and one is a member of our Assembly. The flight leaves Saturday Oct 10th, in the morning, but **more importantly, it returns at 8:45 PM** on the same day, Oct 10th on **Southwest Flight #8284**. There will be Honor Flight people at the airport to assist with directing people to the arrival area for the welcoming. I invite all of you who would like to thank our WWII veterans for their service to meet these Vets at Columbus Airport and welcome them back home. The experience of greeting the returning Vets will be a moment you may never forget as throngs of people cheer and hug and salute these good people.
